

Remarks on Board Schooner E. H. Hatfield

1880

Middle & last part fine breeze from
S.W. with pleasant weather steering
by the wind at 12 Mid. day spoke
the Schooner Agate rich Master
Lat 30° 47' N
Long 75° 18' W

Wednesday July 21

This day begins with a fine breeze
from S.W. with pleasant weather
at 2 P.M. spoke the Schooner N. F. Night
at 1/2 past 4 spoke the Schooner Antarctic
all of Province town Middle part
fresh breeze from S.W. with fine
weather steering by the wind at 5 A.M.
commenced to break out the main
hole for water and provisions

Lat 30° 43' N
Long 75° 00' W

Thursday July 22

This day begins with a fresh breeze
from S.E. by S. steering by the wind
heading S.S.W. all hands employed
in breaking out starting water and
trimming ship got out provisions
saw one sail steering to the eastward
at 5 P.M. finished Middle & last part
fresh breeze from S.W. steering by the
wind 4 sails in sight
at 1/2 past 6 A.M. spoke Lat 30° 33' N
Schooner Sarah E. Lewis of Boston Long 75° 41' W

Friday July 23

This day begins with squally
weather at 3 P.M. took in the mainsail
heading by the wind E.S.E. three sails
in sight

Middle & last part fresh breeze from
S. steering by the wind heading S.E. by E.
three sails in sight

Lat 30° 50' N
Long 74° 31' W

Saturday July 24

This day begins with a fresh
wind from S.E. with cloudy weather
saw the Schooner N. F. Night with
his Boats down after whales
whales going quick to the S.W.
at 7 P.M. the Mate of the Schooner
Amella of New Bedford. came on
Board after letters Middle & last part
squally 4 sails in sight

Lat 30° 25' N
Long 74° 54' W

Sunday July 25

This day begins with light baffin
winds with squalls of rain
the watch verily employed in
ships duty Middle & last part light
baffin winds with squalls of
rain at 7 A.M. spoke the Schooner
Amella of New Bedford

Lat 30° 35' N

Monday July 26 Long 75° 23' W

This day begins with a light
breeze from S.S.W. steering off
N.W. in company with the
Amella 7 whaling Schooners
in sight Middle & last part
squally 7 whaling Schooners in
sight

Lat 30° 35' N
Long 74° 10' W
