

Remarks on Board Schooner E. H. Hatfield

Tuesday July 27 1880

These 24 hours commences with heavy squalls from S.W. Six sails in sight heading a long by the wind S.E. Middle & last part wind from S.W. with squally weather

Lat 30.38

Long 73.23 W

Wednesday July 28

This day begins with a fresh breeze from S.W. with squally weather heading S.E. under short sail. 6 whalers in sight Middle & last part heavy squalls of wind and rain in observation

Thursday July 29

This day begins with light variable winds with squally weather Middle & last part squally weather heavy showers of rain in observation two sails in sight

Friday July 30

This day begins with light baffling winds with heavy showers of rain to sails in sight Middle & last part heavy squalls of wind and rain with a heavy sea on latitude by a count

Lat 30.40 S

Long 73.10 W

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Saturday July 31 1880

This day begins with a fresh breeze from S.W. with heavy squalls of rain and a rough sea on one sail in sight Middle & last part fresh breeze from S.W. heading S.E. by S. heavy squalls of rain

Lat 29.30 N

Long 72.58 W

Sunday August 1 1880

fresh breeze from W.S.W. with cloudy weather steering by the wind heading N.W. by W. the employed in breaking out for provisions Middle & last part light airs and calms with squalls of rain on sail in sight

Lat 30.05 N

Monday August 2 Long 72.36 W

This day begins with a light breeze from N.W. by W. with cloudy weather heading S.W. by W. Middle & last part light variable breezes with squalls of rain

Lat 29.47 N

Tuesday August 3

This day begins with light variable breezes with squalls of rain one sail in sight Middle & last part fine breeze from S.E. by S heading E Lat 30.05 N Long 71.08 W
