This day begins with a fine breeze from S E by S Ship heading E by N the watch variously employed on Bark in sight Middle & last part light wind from S E steering by the wind heading E by N the watch employed in setting up rigging

This day begins with a light breeze from S E with pleasant weather steering by the wind heading E by S Middle & last part light airs and calm with pleasant weather

Sunday August 8 1880

This day begins with a calm and fine weather the watch variously employed in Ships duty this day saw Porpoises that is the nearest we can come to a whale Middle & last part light airs and calms with fine weather

This day begins with a light breeze from S W steering S E. one sail in sight Middle & last part light breeze from S S W with over cast weather steering S E by E.

Tuesday August 10

This day begins with a fine breeze from S W with cloudy weather steering E S E. Middle & last part fine breeze from W N W. with cloudy weather steering E S E. the watch employed in Ships duty

This day begins with a fine breeze from W with pleasant weather steering E S E. Middle & last part fine breeze from W N W steering E. with fine weather
