

## Remarks on Board Schooner E. H. Hatfield

Thursday August 12 - 1880

This day begins with a fine breeze from W. with pleasant weather. Steering E. the watch variously employed in ship's duty. Middle & last part light breeze from NW. Steering ENE fine weather. At 4 past 11 A.M. saw sperm whales at 12 Mid day toward the boats whales going quick saw nothing more of them.

Friday August 13

Lat 31° 30' N  
Long 56° 07' W

This day begins with a light breeze from NW with fine weather. At 6 P.M. the boats came on board saw no whales from the boats. Middle & last part light breeze from NW. with fine weather. Steering ENE. the watch employed in breaking out for provisions.

Saturday August 14

This day begins with a light breeze from W. SW fine weather. Steering ENE. Middle & last part light airs and calms.

## Remarks on Board Schooner E. H. Hatfield

Sunday August 15 - 1880

This day begins with a fine breeze from SW. Steering E by N. pleasant weather. Middle & last part light airs and calms with squalls of rain.

Monday August 16

This day begins with a light breeze from WNW with squalls of rain. Steering ENE. Middle & last part light airs and calms with squalls of rain.

Lat 31° 56' N  
Long 56° 56' W

Tuesday August 17

This day begins with light airs and calms. saw grampuses at 4 P.M. a light breeze sprung up from NE by N heading E by S. Middle & last part light airs and calms. at 5 A.M. fine breeze from S. Steering N by E.

Long 56° 10' W

Wednesday August 18

This day begins with a light breeze from SSE. with squally weather. Steering E by N. one sail in sight. Middle & last part light airs and calms.
