

## Remarks on Board Schooner E. H. Hatfield

Saturday Sept 18 1880

This 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from S.E. with pleasant weather steering S.W. the watch variously employed in ships duty Middle & last part fine breeze from S.E. by E. with pleasant weather

Lat 32° 37' N  
Long 50° 24' W

Sunday Sept 19

These 24 hours begins with light air and calms Middle & last part fine breeze from S.E. with good weather at 1/2 past 6 A.M. saw Sperm whales at 1/2 past 6 A.M. lowered two Boats W Boat struck Starboard Boat got stove

Sperm whales

Monday Sept 20 Lat 32° 36' N  
Long 50° 10' W

This day begins with a fine breeze from S with squally weather at 1 P.M. took the whale to the ship at 4 commenced to cut the whale at 6 P.M. quit cutting Middle and last part blowing fresh from S.E. to N.W. at 8 A.M. put two whale lines on the whale and let him go out the whale laying by the lines 25 fathoms
