Friday Sept 24 1880

This day begins with a calm heavy swell on employed in Boiling Middle & last part the same.

Saturday Sept 25 Lat 31.28 N
Long 40 10 W

This day begins with a calm at 12 Mid day finished Boiling the watch employed in clearing up Middle & last part calm the watch employed in slowing down oil.

Sunday Sept 26 Lat 31.46 N
Long 50 38 W

This day begins with a light air from N heading N E by E. the watch employed in washing ship Middle & last part light air and calm with fine weather at 1/2 past 11 A.M. saw a Sperm whale three miles off

Monday Sept 27 Lat 31.57

This day begins with a light breeze from NNW with fine weather at 1/2 past 1 P.M. lowered three Boats at 6 came on board with out success whale saw the Boats

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Middle & last part light breeze from N E. with fine weather at 1/2 past 6 A.M. saw Sperm whales at 1/2 past 7 lowered the Boats for them Lat 32.10
Long 50.20

Tuesday Sept 28

This day begins with a fresh breeze from N E with cloudy weather at 1 P.M. the Boats came to the Ship with out success whales going quick. Middle & last part fresh breeze from N E at 6 A.M. saw Sperm whales at 1/2 past 7 lowered the Boats at 9 struck. W Boat - and Starboard Bow at 1/2 past 11 took them to the Ship

This day begins with light air air calm at 1 P.M. commenced to cut the whales at 1/2 past 6 finished cutting the whales at 7 set the wet the watch employed in cutting up the whale Middle and last part calm employed in Boiling out the whales

Long 51.11 W

This day begins with a light breeze from N E with light air from N E employed in Boiling
