

Remarks on board Scho. E. H. Hatfield of Edgartown
Tuesday Jan 4th

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the E steering W & Middle part the same latter part Moderate breeze from the ESE steering W & the Emma Jane in company saw two Merchantmen

Lat 28 = 55 W

Long 75 = 10 W

Wednesday Jan 5th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate breeze from the SE steering W & Middle part lying too under short sail to the E latter part at daylight made all sail and steered W & E

Lat 29 = 38 W

Long 74 = 49 W

Thursday Jan 6th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate breeze and fine weather from the SE steering W at Sunland shortened sail and huffed to the wind to the westward Middle part the same latter part fresh breeze from the SW made sail at daylight and steered W by W the Emma Jane in company also saw two other sails

Lat 30 = 16 W

Long 74 = 58 W

Friday Jan 7th

First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze and rain from the W & W heading by the wind to the W & W under short sail Middle part clear latter part wind W and fine weather at daylight made sail and huffed by the wind to the E & E 4 sails in sight

Lat 31 = 07 W

Long 75 = 00 W

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Saturday Jan 8th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate breeze and fine weather from the W heading by the wind to the E & E Middle part under short sail latter part wind W & E and rain at 8 AM saw the Emma Jane with her boats down near ship and stood for her but saw nothing at 11 AM blowing a gale and rain

Sunday Jan 9th

First part of these 24 hours a gale from the E & E with rain and heavy sea running for various directions heading to the W under storm sails Middle part wind hauling to the SE and still blowing latter part wind SW and a heavy cross sea and still blowing

Lat 31 = 50 W

Long 75 = 13 W

Monday 10th

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze and ruggel from the SW Middle part wore ship to the W latter part at 10 AM wore ship to the SE still ruggel

Lat 31 = 55 W

Long 75 = 25 W

Tuesday 11th

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze and frequent squalls of rain Middle part the same latter part at daylight wind hauling to the W with thick rain weather at noon wind W & E and rain

Lat 31 = 54 W

Long 74 = 48 W

Wednesday 12th

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the E & E heading by the wind to the SE Middle part strong breeze and squalls from W & W wore ship to the W latter part a gale lying under short sail

Lat 31 = 09 W Long 74 = 15 W
