

Remarks on board Scho. E. H. Hatfield of Edgartown
Thursday Jan 13th

First part of these 24 hours a Moderate gale from the W by lying under storm sail weather clear & cloudy Middle part Moderating latter part light breeze and fine weather from the E made all sail and heeled to the W & C saw two Gulls

Lat 30 = 51 W

Long 74 = 59 W

Friday Jan 14th

First part of these 24 hours light breeze from the E & C steering W by E under all sail at sundown took in sail Middle part increasing winds and hauling to the S W latter part strong breeze and ruggled steering W by E saw Porpoise and one Finback and 4 seals

Lat 31 = 00 W

Long 74 = 10 W

Saturday Jan 15th

First part of these 24 hours increasing winds from the S W steering W by E at sundown took in sail at 8 PM blowing a gale from the W S W have too under short sail Middle had a heavy squall and shift of wind to the W W latter part wind steadily at W and Moderating steering E by E

Lat 30 = 52 W

Long 73 = 22 W

Sunday Jan 16th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate Breeze from the W steering W by E at sundown took in sail and heeled to the wind to the W Middle part wind hauling to the W & E latter part wind S steering W by E under all sail saw two seals

Lat 31 = 05 W

Long 75 = 30 W

Monday Jan 17th

First part of these 24 hours Fresh Breeze from the S with thick cloudy weather steering W by E at sundown took in sail Middle and latter parts wind W W heading to the W by E under all sail

Lat 31 = 31 W

Long 73 = 35 W

Tuesday Jan 18th

First part of these 24 hours Fresh Breeze from the W steering to the W by E at sundown took in sail Middle part the same latter part wind W by E steering W by W saw several seals

Lat 31 = 38 W

Long 74 = 45 W

Wednesday Jan 19th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate Breeze from the E & C with thick foggy weather steering W by E at sundown took in sail Middle part the same heading to the W latter part at daylight made sail & steered W by W several sails in sight

Lat 31 = 47 W

Long 75 = 30 W

Thursday Jan 20th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate breeze from the S E and overcast steering W by W at 1 PM saw sperm Whales at 1:30 PM saw three Boats and chased whales going quick and different directions at 5 PM all three struck one Boat parted line at 10 PM took two Whales alongside weather thick and raining latter part at 10 PM commenced cutting at noon finished cutting one Whale
