

Remarks on board Scho'r E off Hatfield of Edgartown
Friday Jan 21th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate breeze from the S with thick rain. Weather employed at cutting at 1 P.M. finished and commenced clearing up the deck and cutting blubber at 4 P.M. commenced bailing at 6 P.M. weather clearing up and wind breezing from the S.W. at midnight blowing hard and ruggled put the mast of the Blubber down in the Chain Hatch latter part at 4 A.M. to ruggled to hail coal down dark at 5 A.M. very violent squalls of wind and rain at 8 A.M. lost the starboard boat by the Foremast Dismant breaking with everything in her but the line so Enes blowing heavy from the S.W. have too under storm sails

Lat 32 = 20 W
Long 75 = 64 W

Saturday Jan 22

First part of these 24 hours a gale from the S.W. have too on the starboard tack under storm sails at 4 P.M. moderating a little Middle part still moderating latter part quite moderate but a heavy sea running at daylight commenced bailing

Lat 31 = 46 W
Long 74 = 46 W

Sunday Jan 23

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from W.W. heading by the wind to the S.W. employed at bailing Middle and latter part the same

Monday Jan 24th

First part of these 24 hours Moderate breeze from the W.W. heading by the wind to the S.W. employed at bailing at 6 P.M. finished bailing Middle part light breeze from the W.W. and rain latter part wind or cones still raining employed at standing down sail in the Main Hatch at 10 A.M. finished so Enes

Lat 30
Tuesday Jan 25th

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the W.W. heading to the W.W. employed at washing ship Middle part increasing wind from the E have too under storm sails latter part a gale from the W.W. and rain

Lat 30
Wednesday Jan 26th

First part of these 24 hours a gale from the W.W. and wind hauling to the W and moderating set double reef Fore sail jib & Tye sail heading to the W Middle part still moderating and clear latter part Moderate breeze from the W.W. heading by the wind to the W.W. at 7 A.M. saw White Water ahead about 4 miles set make all sail but saw nothing more of it at 10 A.M. wind W.W. tacked to the W.E. and sail in sight

Lat 31 = 10 W
Long 76 = 00 W

Thursday Jan 27th

All these 24 hours strong breeze from the W.W. steering by the wind to the W.E. by W under double reef Fore sail jib & Tye sail

Lat 31 = 35 W
Long 75 = 55 W
