

Remarks anchored 10th off Hatfield of Edgartown
Thursday March 10th

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the S.W. lying at Anchor Middle part the same latter part at daylight got underway and stood outside at 9 AM wind breeze on and barometer falling came in to anchor and the Capt went ashore to look for Antares Sylvia who went ashore last night in the boat when the boat was ready to return anchored could not be found think he has deserted

Friday March 11th

First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the S.W. and rain lying at Anchor Middle part the same latter part at daylight got underway and stood outside the Capt remaining ashore

Saturday March 12th

First part of these 24 hours light breeze from the S.W. cruising outside and at 5 PM came in to anchor Middle part the same latter part wind S.E. and raining remained at anchor

Sunday March 13th

All these 24 hours lying at anchor with hall stormy weather and thick fog

Monday March 14th

First part of these 24 hours lying at anchor Middle part weather clearing up latter light breeze from S.W. got underway and stood outside

Tuesday March 15th

First part of these 24 hours light breeze from the S.W. cruising outside at sundown came in to anchor Middle part the same the boat went ashore the evening and two men deserted Manuel Garcia a boatsteerer and John Francis a Foremast Hand. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. got underway and stood outside the Capt remaining ashore to look for runaways

Wednesday 16th

First part of these 24 hours light breeze from the S.W. cruising outside at sundown came in to anchor at 7 PM the Capt returned anchored bringing Antares Sylvia Middle part the same Middle part the same latter part at daylight got underway and stood out side at noon calm at anchor outside

Thursday March 17th

First part of these 24 hours calm at 3 PM a light breeze from the S.E. hove up the anchor put the boat ahead and towed the vessel in to anchor Middle part raining latter part the same lying at anchor

Friday March 18th

First part of these 24 hours wind S.W. and stormy lying at anchor Middle part the same latter part at 6 AM the 2nd Mate who had been ashore for the night returned ashore and was taken very suddenly ill with
