

Remarks on board Sch. E. H. Hatfield of Edgartown
Tuesday Apr 5th

First part of these 24 haws a gale from the S.W. still lying at Anchor Middle part the same latter part moderating same at 7 AM got underway and stood out side at 10 AM blowing a gale from S.W. came in and anchored again so ends

Wednesday Apr 6th

First part of these 24 haws blowing gale from the S.W. remaining at Anchor Middle part moderating latter part calm sent one boats crew a heading

Thursday Apr 7th

First part of these 24 haws Moderate breeze from the W. remained at Anchor

Friday Apr 8th

First part of these 24 haws calm latter part wind W.E. and raining & blowing a stiff breeze

Saturday Apr 9th

All these 24 haws light air and calm employed at cutting and getting aboard dead from ball of lead

Sunday Apr 10th

All these 24 haws light air and calm lying at Anchor

Monday Apr 11th

First part of these 24 haws light air and calm latter part at 8 AM got under way and stood out side

Tuesday Apr 12th

First part of these Moderate breeze from the W. at 1 PM came into Anchor and sent part of the crew a heading latter part light breeze from the S.W. sent one boats crew a heading the remainder of the crew employed at work about the vessel latter part a gale from the W.E.

Wednesday Apr 13th

First part of these 24 haws a gale from the W.E. at 5 PM Moderate and fine weather latter part light breeze from the S. remained at Anchor

Thursday Apr 14th

First part of these 24 haws Moderate breezes and low barometer at 10 PM blowing a gale from the S. at midnight wind hauling to the W.W. latter part blowing a gale from W.E. lying with both Anchors down

Friday Apr 15th

First part of these 24 haws a gale from the W.E. at 3 PM wind backed to the W. and Moderated latter part Moderate breeze from the W.W. at daylight got underway and stood out side
