Tuesday May 4th

First part of the 24 haws light breeze
from the S steering W by W at 2 PM
saw Cape Sackant at 3 PM calm at
5 PM came to anchor in 8 fathoms
of water latter part at daylight a
light breeze from the S got underway
and ran in and anchored off Port
Macon at Beaufort at 7:30 AM

a gang of carpenters at work on
the vessel repairing damage that was
done by gales and heavy weather
of last Dec & Jan

landed his boat taken one man
with him and gone to Marshfield City
at midnight he not returning sent
a boat to look him found the boat
lying at wharf the men could not
be found, suppose they have deserted
took the boat to the vessel latter
part the Capt went ashore but
could hear nothing of them
