Tuesday May 17th

First part of these 24 haws made Breezes from the W steering S by E
stowed under and cable. Latter part
Breeze Breezes from the W steering S by E
saw a number of sailing vessels &
steamers

First part of these 24 haws commenced
with light baffling wind and falling
squalls of rain steering E by S
Latter part the same

All these 24 haws light baffling winds &
calms steering E by S latter part much
the same the Capt much better and sail in
sight

Sunday May 22nd

First part of these 24 haws light
baffling winds and calms steering E by S
at 4 PM saw a sail to the S under
short sail having the appearance of
being abandoned the wind being very
light took a boat and went to her got
to her about 9 PM found her to be the
Schr Dingy of Boston lumber loaded
and full of water deck soiled and
Main Hatch washed away with a
three reef fore sail set. concluded that
by stapling up the Hatch that she might
be pumped out and a light onboard
of her and remained by all night at
daylight went aboard of her with all
hands but three men with hammers
nails & boards and canvas and in
about two hours succeeded in stapling
the Hatch and commenced pumping
and soon found the water fast
decreasing so that light sails and
calm
