

Remarks on board Sch. E. H. Sealfield
Thursday, June, 2nd 1881.

First part of these 24 hours blowing strong from the Westward steering E. by S. middle part the same. Latter part wind S. West blowing strong steering E. by S.

Friday, June, 3rd

First part of these 24 hours blowing strong from the S. West steering E. by N. middle part wind the same at 11.45 P.M. raised Bermuda light right ahead judge it to be about 30 miles off at 12 P.M. luffed to the wind on the starboard tack. at daylight kept off for the lighthouse it bearing N. East. at 9 A.M. pilot spoke us but did not take him aboard. the starboard boat and carried the Capt ashore and boat returned to the Sch. at 11. A.M. latter part wind the same lying off and on

Saturday June 4th

First part of these 24 hours blowing strong with frequent rain squalls varying from S. to West. middle part heavy wind and rain squalls with thunder and lightning latter part still blowing and raining wind about West still lying off and on

Monday, June, 6th 1881.

First part of these 24 hours wind West and very moderate middle part calm still lying off and on went ashore at 9 A.M. and brought off some onions and potatoes and 3 men and a boy which the Capt. had shipped and returned to the shore at 11.30 A.M. latter part wind S. West and very moderate

Lat - by Obs. 32.12. lighthouse in 32.15. bearing N.E.

Lon by Chronometer 64.54 " in 64.50 bearing N.E. 4 miles

Tuesday, June, 7th

First part of these 24 hours wind West very moderate Capt. came aboard at 1 P.M. and at 2 P.M. kept off steering S. East middle and latter part wind S. West saw some grampuses & picked up a plank.

Wednesday, June, 8th

First part of these 24 hours moderate breeze from the Westward shortened sail at dark and layed to heading to the Northward. middle part much the same latter part wind S. S. E. steering by the wind heading about East.

Thursday, June, 9th

First part of these 24 hours very moderate wind S. steering full and by heading E. S. E. at 4 P.M. raised a school of Blackfish and Porpoises did not lower. middle part much the same ship bore too latter part wind freshening a little at 11.30 A.M. raised a breach but could not make it out
