

Remarks on board. Schr. E. H. Hatfield
Saturday, June 23rd 1881.

First part of these 24 hours light breezes from S. S. W. heading S. East at 7 P.M. spoke the Schr. Carrie W. Clark, having taken nothing this cruise middle part wind the same very moderate latter part moderate wind varying from E. S. E. to S. S. E. wore ship at 8 A.M. and headed to the westward. passed in sight of no sailing vessels.

Saturday June 26th

First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes from S. S. East heading about S. West at 6.30 P.M. spoke the B.K. Ocean 37 days from Montevideo bound for Com. Morris ground having taken nothing this cruise middle part strong breezes latter part the same with passing rain squalls wore ship at 9 A.M. and headed to the Eastward

Sunday June 27th

First part of these 24 hours moderate breezes from S. S. E. middle and latter strong breezes from West and N. West with passing rain squalls at 6 A.M. saw a school of grampuses. latter part steering S. E. by South

Tuesday June 28th

First part of these 24 hours light and moderate breezes from the Westward steering S. East. watch employed in ship's duty at 7 P.M. spoke the Brig D. A. Small with 20 bbls two months from home. middle and latter part wind much the same steering S. East also saw a whaling Schr at 6 P.M. but did not speak her - Lat 30.41. Long 48.41.

First part of these 24 hours begin with light airs from the westward steering S. E. middle and latter part light airs from various points heading to the Eastward watch employed in doing ship's duty

Thursday, June 30th

First part of these 24 hours light breezes from S. East steering by the wind on the starboard tack, middle part heading S. West latter part standing on different tacks by the wind. one sail in sight watch employed in breaking out flour.

Friday July 1st 1881.

First part of these 24 hours begin with light breezes from S. E. steering by the wind on starboard tack at 6 P.M. raised a white water but did not see it again. middle and latter wind freshening a little ship heading from South to S. West. watch employed in ship's duty

Long 48.40. W.

Saturday, July 2nd

First part of these 24 hours light airs from S. East. steering by the wind heading to westward middle and latter part much the same wore ship at 6.30 A.M. and headed to the Eastward
