Wednesday, August 3rd 1881.

First part of these 24 hours begin with moderate breezes from the N. East steering N. S. West. at sunset hauled by the wind on port tack heading about E. S. E. at 6.30 a.m. wore ship and steered by the wind on starboard tack heading N. N. West. wind about N. East and moderate. watches variously employed.

Thursday, Aug. 4th

First part of these 24 hours begin with moderate breezes from the N. E. steering by the wind on starboard tack middle part much the same shortened sail at dark and lay to all night. latter part wind E. N. E. steering by the wind on starboard heading N. watch employed in ship's duty

Friday, Aug. 5th

First part of these 24 hours begin with moderate breezes from E. N. E. steering by the wind on starboard tack middle part strong breezes from the same quarter schr lying to under foresail latter part much the same heading about N. by E. watches variously employed saw a number of grampuses

First part of these 24 hours begin with moderate breezes from N. E. steering by the wind on starboard at 2 P.M. passed a large stick of timber lowered a boat and caught some fish from around it. middle and latter part wind and weather much the same schr heading N. N. E.

Sunday, Aug. 7th 1881.

First part of these 24 hours begin with moderate breezes from E. S. E. steering by the wind on starboard tack heading N. East. middle part much the same with passing rain squalls latter part wind S. East and blowing strong wore ship at sunrise and steered by the wind on the port tack heading S. S. West.

Monday, Aug. 8th

First part of these 24 hours begin with strong breezes from S. E. steering by the wind on port tack middle part wind moderating some. lying to under foresail latter part wind increasing some steering by the wind on port tack heading S. West. watch employed in breaking out water

Tuesday, Aug. 9th

First part of these 24 hours begin with moderate breezes from S. E. steering by the wind on port tack heading from S. to S. West. middle and latter part wind S. S. E. and very light. steering by the wind heading S. W. watches variously employed

Wednesday, Aug. 10th

First part of these 24 hours begin with light airs from S. E. steering by the wind on port tack middle and latter part much the same wore ship at dark and headed about N. E. on starboard tack wind S. East and very light.
