 This day began with strong
 breezes and squally weather
 at 3 P.M. received water from
 shore at 4 P.M. Stowed of
 the whole latter part the same
 all hands employed getting ready
 for sea at 11 P.M. all ready fore
 sea so ends this day

Wednesday May the 17 1882
 This day began with fresh breezes and
 clear weather at 2 P.M. got of some
 potatoes latter part the same at day
 light called all hands and
 hove up the anchor and sailed
 from Barbadoes after brack
 list and bent the chains and
 stowed away the anchor
 so ends this day

Thursday May 18 1882
 This day began with fresh
 breezes and clear weather the
 land being 20 miles of bearing
 S by E latter part strong
 breezes and heavy seas heading
 by the wind N by E we
 reefed main sail so ends

Friday May 19 1882
 This day began with strong
 breezes and heavy seas employed
 firing trisail latter part the
 same the watch employed
 repairing the trisail steering
 round N by E having
 reef main sail so
 so ends this day

Saturday May 20 1882
 This day began with
 fresh breezes and clear
 weather latter part the same
 heading by the wind N by E
 the watch employed repairing
 main sail at 10 P.M. finished
 the mainsail and set it so ends

Sunday May the 21 1882
 first part of these 24 hours
 began with moderate winds
 at 10 clear weather the employed
 repairing fore sail at sun
 down reefed the mainsail
 latter part strong breezes heading
 by the wind N by E having
 reefed main sail so ends

Monday May the 22 1882
 This day began with light
 winds and clear weather
 at 7 P.M. rose humpback
 breaching at 5.30 P.M. sighted
 a sail latter part fresh breezes
 from E by S the watch employed
 repairing mainsail so ends

Tuesday May the 23 1882
 This day began with fresh
 breezes from E by S heading
 by the wind N by E at 2
 P.M. rose whales close to the
 ship got ready and lowered
 2 buoys for them S B got
 the chance went up and struck
 L B come up and struck
 secured 2
