

latter part light breezes from E & S E at day life called all hands and got ready for cutting at 5.30 P.M. commenced cutting at 11 P.M. got one whale in so ends this day

Wednesday May the 24. 1882
This day began with moderate winds at 1 P.M. hooked on to second whale at 4 finished cutting and cleared off deck latter part the same the watch employed cutting up blubber at day life began to cut the head at 7 P.M. got back first started the work so ends

Thursday May the 25. 1882
This day began with light breezes and clear weather all hands employed cutting blubber latter part the same all hands employed boiling and stowing down oil so ends

Friday May the 26. 1882
This day began with light breeze and clear weather all hands employed boiling and stowing down oil latter part much the same at 8 P.M. finished boiling all hands employed stowing the oil below nothing in sight so ends this day

Saturday May the 27. 1882
This day began with light winds and clear weather all hands employed putting the oil below at 4 P.M. finished and washed off the Decks latter part the same employed washing and other duties so ends this day

Sunday May the 28. 1882
This day began with fine weather at sundown took in main sail and set the trisail latter part the same steering N by W nothing seen this day so ends
This day Lat 25.45. Long 55.45

Monday May the 29. 1882
This day began with light winds and squally weather from S. S. W. steering N by W latter part the same at day life took down & flying gill & halibut N Blacks to be filed at 8 P.M. rose a large whale got ready & was lowered 2 boats for him S. B. got the chance went on and struck S. B. struck second boat so ends this day

Tuesday May the 30. 1882
This day began moderate winds from S. S. W all hands employed getting ready for cutting at day life called all hands commenced cutting at 10.30 P.M. got off the head so ends this day
Lat 26.25. Long 55.25
