

Wednesday May 31. 1882

This day began with fine weather
Employed cutting at 4.8 m. got in
the body and ended the same
at day light. Called all hands and
hooked on the head at 9.00 m.
got the head on deck and got
Brack fist at 10.4 m. balled
the case so ends this day
Sat Long

Thursday June the 1. 1882

This day began with fresh breezes
and squally at 3.8 m. started
the works latter part the same
After Brack fist all hands employ
boiling and cutting blubber
and pumping water below to take
the oil so ends this day

Friday June the 2. 1882

This day began with fine
weather and moderate seas
and clear all hands employed
boiling and cutting blubber
at 6.8 m. got supper and set the
watch latter part the same
all hands employed boiling
and stowing the oil below
so ends this day

Saturday June the 3. 1882

This day began with calm
Employed boiling latter part
the same all hands employed
and stowing down oil so ends
this day Lat 27.21... Lat 54.22

Sunday June the 4. 1882

This day began with calm all
hands employed boiling and
stowing down the oil at 4.8 m.
finished boiling and stowed of
the whole latter part the same
Nothing doing so ends this

Monday June the 5. 1882

This day began with light winds
and clear weather from E S E
steering N N E fore sail
and flying jib set latter part
the same after brack fist all
hands employed putting oil
below until 9.30.00 m.
then the watch went below
so ends this day
Sat Long

Tuesday June the 6. 1882

This day began with light winds
and clear from S S E steering
Course N N E latter part the
same employed ship duty
so ends this day

Wednesday June the

7. 1882 This day began with
light winds and clear weather from
the south steering N E at 2
8 m. set the mainsail at
sundown tope in mainsail
and set the trisail latter part
squally the watch employed
heaving the boats steering
to North so ends
Sat Long
