

Wednesday June the 28
1882 This day began with
strong winds and heavy
seas from W by N at 3
P.M. we were ship to south
and dabled reef the
fore sail at sundown
reef the Gib latter part the
same heading by the wind N by W
heavy seas rolling from N by W
no mast head stood this
day so ends this day
Lat Long

Thursday June the 29. 1882
this day began with strong
winds and heavy seas
from W by S at 7 P.M. we were ship
to S by S south latter part the
same at 9 A.M. we were ship to North
heading W by N under short
sail so ends this day
Lat 32.13. Long 49.17

Friday June the 30, 1882
this day began with more
moderate weather from W by N
heading by W by N at 7 P.M.
turned reef out the fore sail
at dark reefed it again
latter part the same
headed the same at 9
A.M. turned reef out
fore sail so ends
this day

Saturday July the 1. 1882
this day began with moderate
winds and smoky weather
from S by S at 3 P.M.
we were ship to south
latter part the same heading by
the wind W by N under short
sail at 7.30 A.M. got up
tables and the watch got out
flour so ends this day
Lat Long 50.38

Sunday July 2. 1882
this day began with fresh
breezes and clear weather
at 2 P.M. we were ship to
south at dark reefed the
fore sail latter part the
same heading by the wind
N by W by west at daylight turned
out reef so ends this day
Lat 32.19: Long 51.01

Monday began with
moderate winds and clear
from S by W by W. July
the 3. 1882 at sundown
take in mainsail flying
Gib and reef the fore sail
latter part the same at
daylight turn out reef at
9 A.M. set all sail heading
N by W by W
