Commences with very fresh trades. it blows a common gale of wind at 5 P.M. I had the man taken out of bonds after he acknowledged his fault and promised better behavior. I may God incline his heart to do good and spare me further trouble. Oh God be merciful to me and give me grace to bear all with Christian fortitude. His Grace is sufficient for me. Latter part the same. At 11 A.M. the man that stayed on shore all night came on board, as he said right. So now employed in various jobs about the vessel.

Remarks On Board Thursday Jan 26

Commences with very fresh trades from the Eastward. Employed in repairing the fore sail and calking the Vents. Barward. Latter part rather more moderate. Employed in repairing the fore sail. So ends

Commences with fresh trades from the Eastward. Employed in repairing the foresail and sails. Latter part fresh trades Employed in repairing the foresail a job. So ends

Remarks On Board Saturday Jan 28th 1854

Commences with fresh trades all hands employed in repairing sails. Latter part fresh gales from the E. N. E. they say on shore that they never knew such a time before at the Island. At 9 A.M. I went on shore at Pradon some with Capt Gardner. So ends

Remarks On Board Sunday Jan 29th 1854

Commences with fresh gales from the Eastward. At 4 P.M. cleared the vessel and returned on board it is very rough
