

Schooner E. Nickerson off the Isle of St. 1st
Remarks on Board Monday Feb 6th 1854

Commenced with fresh trades the vessel at anchor in the Harbour of St. Martins latter part moderate at 8 A.M. I went on shore to see if I could get a permit to anchor. I got this far, that is I could anchor by paying a charge equal to 50 cts a day that is the squares fee. at 11 3/4 I returned to the vessel and got under way to Ensis 1854

Remarks on Board Tuesday Feb 7th 1854

Commenced with moderate trades Employed Boiling at 6 P.M. came to anchor in 10 fathoms of water latter part fine at 6 1/2 A.M. finished Boiling, and stowed down some of it I saw nothing of note

Remarks on Board Wednesday Feb 8th 1854

Commenced with fine weather Employed in stowing down oil at 7 P.M. came to anchor in Medicia Bay in 10 fathoms of water at 5 1/2 A.M. hove up our anchor but saw nothing this day

Remarks on Board Thursday Feb 9th 1854

Commenced with fresh trades at 2 P.M. I lowered my boat and went in to catch some fish but caught 9 and returned on board at 6 P.M. came to anchor in the Bay in 5 fathoms of water. latter part the same at 5 A.M. hove up our anchor and saw nothing of note

Remarks on Board Friday Feb 10th 1854

First part fresh trades on clear at 1 1/2 P.M. came to anchor to get the Bobb Stays at 4 P.M. went on board the Drigg September and got my craft that I brought of Capt. Garman's and his medicine. What I got it was nearly Robbed of all the valuable medicine I took it with the privilege of using what I wished out of it. latter part light trades and cloudy with some showers. On shore is the hump backs. The Land will stress us all in good time. At Ensis
