at 4 P. M. saw On Back at

Latter part quite moderate at 9 A. M.
the Capt. went on shore to settle
up with the Consul. at 9 1/2 finished
Boiling and commenced to stow down

Wednesday 15th 1854
Remarks On Board Thursday March

Commences with moderate trades at
3 the Capt. returned to the vessel at 4
got under way and put Mr. Fishers half
of the Oil On Board the Willis. and one
of our men by the name of Colliker he having
been sick ever since we left Provincetown
at 8 1/2 A. M. took in the S. Boat to repair the
bing stove. at 11 1/2 lowered for S. B. Back

Remarks On Board Thursday March 16

Commences with moderate trades at 12 1/4
P. M. the S. Boat struck at 1 took him along
side. at 2 commenced cutting at 5 finished
and made sail and stood in for the
Land. at 9 set whole watches and commenced
clearing away for Boiling at 2 A. M. set
the fire going at 19 saw a hump Back
at 11 1/2 lowered the S. Boat for S. B.
But could not get near

Remarks On Board Friday March 17th

Commences with moderate trades. saw a
number of S. B. Backs but they were going
quick at 7 came to anchor in Mollerich
Bay at 8 put the S. Boat on the
cranes at 1 P. M. came to anchor in
Mondeira Bay at 5 A. M. finished
Boiling and got under way at 9 commenced
stowing down S. B. Backs. I feel thankful
for it but we ought to have had
more with the whales we have struck
