Remarks On Board Thursday March 30th

Commenced with fresh trades at 1 P.M.
finished cutting at 6 finished cutting
the Blubber up. Still at anchor.
at 6 1/2 A.M. hove up the anchor
at 7 1/2 lowered for 16 Backs at
12 Returned to the vessel
at 6 A.M. commenced Boiling
the whale

So Ends this Day

Remarks On Board Friday March 31st 1854

Commenced with moderate trades.
Employed Boiling at 2 P.M.
the Old man lowered for a 16 Back
and started But did not fasten. at
5 P.M. returned to the vessel. At
6 P.M. came to anchor. at 5 A.M.
finished Boiling at 9 commenced stowing
down at 11 finished and commenced
washing the vessel. Saw a number
of 16 Backs going quick so
that I did not lower

Remarks On Board Saturday April 1st 1854

Commenced with fresh trades Employed
clearing up. Licks at 6 P.M.
came to anchor at 6 A.M. got under
way at 8 1/2 lowered for 16 Backs
but they were going so quick that
we did not get near at 10 1/2 returned
to the vessel

So Ends this Day

Remarks On Board Sunday April 2nd 1854

Commenced with moderate trades
at 6 P.M. came to anchor. I
feel thankful for a day of rest; and
I hope that it will be a day of rest
to the mind as well as body. Latter
part fine weather the variable.
Saw a number of 16 Backs.
So Ends as usual with prayer. I
should very much like to be at
home this evening. with those of
my friends that are dear to me.
it would be a treat indeed to
go to meeting. But I hope by
the blessing of God to be with
his followers in the house of worship
ere many months are gone.
