Remarks On Board Monday June 5th 1854

Commences with Gentle Breezes from the Eastward, at 5 1/2 P.M. Changes our course to S.W. Latter part the same.

Lat 27° 59' Long 63° 29'

Remarks On Board Tuesday June 6th

Commences with Gentle Breezes from the E.S.E. Steering S.W. at 4 1/2 P.M. Changes the course to S.W. by S. Latter part clear, at 6 A.M.

Saw a Brig Steering S.E. so Enos

Lat 26° 48' Long 64° 10'

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 7th

Commences with moderate Breeze from S.E. by S. and Squalls. Steering S.W. by S. Latter part moderate. Amended the Main Sail and repaired it. and Painted the Mast to Ends

Lat 28° 27' Long 65° 14'

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Remarks On Board Thursday June 8th 1854

Commences with Moderate Breezes from S.S.E. Steering S.W. by S. Saw a vessel Steering to the Northward. Latter part the same. Various Employed

Lat 30° 29' Long 66° 21'

Remarks On Board Friday June 9th

Commences with fresh Breezes and Squalls from the Southward. Steering S.W. by S. at 5 P.M. Changes the course to S.S.W. at 6 1/2 took in the Gaff top Sail had have been lost thus far with good winds. And it appears to me that God has been good to us all the voyage. abundantly more than we have deserved. I feel sometimes that I am very ungrateful for his mercy. But I hope soon to get where I can gain more of his grace. Latter part some Squalls Employed cleaning the vessel
