Remarks On Board Saturday June 10th 1854

Commenced with moderate breezes from the S.W., steering S. by E. Latter part moderate breezes and calm at 8^{1/2} tacked to the Eastward at 10. The wind S.E. steering S. by E.

Lat 35° 13' Long 68° 36'

Remarks On Board Sunday 11th 1854

Commenced with light airs from the S.W. at 5 hauled the W. E. S. and more breeze. steering S. by E. another Sabbath has come. Altho' we are very near home, if I could only be at home I to go to Church. I will not murmur for the same God over all, is rich to all that call upon him. On the Sea, or on the Land. Latter part wind from the Westward

Remarks On Board Monday 12th June 1854

Commenced with moderate breezes from the Westward and Rain. at 8 P.M. the wind hauled to the Northward. saw a Brig steering S.E. at 3 P.M. ran into the Stream! Latter part Rain and Calm. saw Schooner steering to the S.E.

Lat 38° 43' Long 68° 56'

Remarks On Board Tuesday June 13th 1854

Commenced with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering S. by E. to the S.W. saw a Brig steering the same. at 7 P.M. the Calm flowered away all the sails. Middle part Calm. at 1 P.M. took a light breeze from the Eastward steering S. saw a number of sails. Employed in painting the vessel.
