

Journal of a voyage in ship Eagle of New Bedford
To the Pacific Ocean and back to New Bedford

Tuesday Dec.
ember 3th 1844

Commenced with fresh breezes from
the Eastward at 9 A.M. took the
Anchor and proceeded to sea at
Noon Discharged the pilot and
Stierdy S.S. in company with both
at 10 to so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday 4th

Commenced with strong breezes from
E.S.E. doubled reefed the topsails and
steered S.E. by E. At Midnight took
in fore and main topsails at 9 A.M.
wind S.E. and thick, set the topsails
and jib, No Observation

Thursday 5th

Commenced with moderate breezes
from S.E. by E, with rain, steering
by the wind to the South at 3 P.M.
hauled round to the Northward,
steered S.E. under doubled reefed
topsails, so ends these 24 hours
No Observation

Friday 6th

Commenced with strong breezes from
S.E. by E, at 1 P.M. saw a brig steering
E.S.E., at 7 P.M. saw a ship and
1 brig, at 11 A.M. saw a ship standing
to the Northward, so ends these
24 hours
