

Saturday Dec, 7th 1845

Commenced with brisk breezes from the Eastward with some light rain, steering by the wind to the South, middle part light breezes and variable at 11 PM were ship to the Eastward, wind S by E, Steered ESE, saw two sails one of them the Ontario, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs 36.22

Sunday Dec 8th

Commenced with brisk breezes from the South West, at 3 PM spoke the Ontario, middle and latter part strong breezes from the Westward steering ESE, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs, 35.46

Monday Dec, 9

Commenced with strong breezes from the Westward, steering ESE, middle part wind North latter part NNE and moderate, so ends these 24 hours No Observation

Tuesday Dec, 10

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. and cloudy weather, steering by the wind to the Eastward, at 8 AM backed to the Northward, wind ESE and light at 11 AM wind SSE, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs 34.13

Wednesday Dec, 11

Commenced with moderate breezes from the South, Steered S by E, middle and latter part fresh breezes from N.E., Steered East, saw two sails, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs, 34.13 long 55.50

Wednesday January 1st 1846

Commenced with fresh trades and clear weather, steering S.W. by S, at 8 AM steered SSE so ends these 24 hours latitude by Observation 18.49 longitude 24.37

Thursday 2th



Commenced with fresh trades and fine weather, at 1 PM steered S by W, at 3 PM S by E at daylight saw the land at 8 AM St. Nicholas bearing SW distant 6 miles saw a shoal of sperm whales boards after them struck & saved three, lanced some at noon got the whales alongside, so ends these 24 hours

Friday 3th

Commenced with strong trades and a bad swell on, at sun down got 2 of the whales in and lanced by the other for the night, at 9 AM got the whale in and backed to the Northward, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs, 14.7

Saturday 4th

Commenced with strong trades and clear weather, employed in boiling, at 5 PM backed off the land 2 miles distant, at 9 AM went on shore with one boat to trade, at noon came on board and wrote letters to send home by the first opportunity, so ends these 24 hours
