

Saturday Feb 15th

Commenced with Calms, Imp-
loyed in Binding new sails
middle part the same latter
part light breezes from the
Westward, so ends these 24
hours latitude by Obs, 39° 39'
longitude 48° 52'

Sunday Feb 16th

Commenced with light breezes
from the Westward, at 7
P.M. wind hauled round to
the Southward wore ship
and steered N. N. W. middle
part wind E. S. E. latter part
S. E. so ends these 24 hours
latitude by Obs, 39° 15' longitude
49° 24'

Monday Feb 17th

Commenced with strong
breezes from the Eastward
at 2 P.M. saw a sail, at
5 P.M. spoke ship Pagan
of Nantucket 41 months
built 1800 bbls of sperm oil,
middle and latter part the
same, at 6 A.M. wore ship
and steered S. by E. so ends
these 24 hours latitude by
Observation 38° 24'

Tuesday Feb 18th

Commenced with strong breezes
from the Eastward, with
same rain, at 8 P.M. Departed
this ship for a better one, spoke
Charles E. West-bain bay with
consumption, at 10 A.M. light
air from the N.W. so ends these
24 hours, latitude by Obs 37° 59'
long 50° 01'

1845
Wednesday Feb 19th

Commenced with fresh breezes
from S.W. at 7 P.M. committed
the body to the Deep to rise
when the sea shall give up its
dead, middle and latter part
wind N. S. W. saw a ship one
bark and one brig, so ends these
24 hours, latitude by Obs, 39° 01'

Thursday 20th

Commenced with strong gales from
N. S. W. at 3 P.M. wore ship to the
Northward, middle part the same
latter part more moderate, saw
the brig Annawan, and a Barque
so ends these 24 hours latitude
by Obs, 39° 50' longitude 49° 32'

Friday 21th

Commenced with strong breezes
from the S.W. at 6.30 P.M.
spoke bark Alvirabeth of Nantucket
poisset, 6 months out with
230 bbls of sperm oil had
taken but 2 whales, middle
part light breezes, latter part
wind from E to N.E. saw nothing
so ends these 24 hours latitude by
Obs, 38° 10' longitude 50° 49'

Saturday 22th

Commenced with fresh breezes
from N.W. middle and latter
part wind N. N. W. steered S. W.
so ends these 24 hours latitude
by Observation 39° 51'
