

Tuesday March 11th

Commenced with strong breezes from N. by E. heading to the N. E. hauling out the whale middle and latter part, strong gale, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Observation 44.24

Wednesday 12th

Commenced with strong breezes from N. by E. and foggy, middle and latter part the same, at 8 A. M. finished hauling out the whale, so ends these 24 hours, No Obs.

Thursday 13th

Commenced with strong gale from N. by E. at 6 P. M. wind hauled out at 8 P. M. middle part wind S. by E. latter part light air and calm, broke out the main hatch way into commenced stowing down the oil, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs 45.40

Friday 14th

Commenced with light air from the N. by E. steering by the wind to the N. E. middle part the same latter part wind North, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs 45.29 longitude 53.53

Saturday 15th

Commenced with light breeze from the North, at 2 P. M. went ship to the Westward, at 5.40 P. M. saw a sail at 9 P. M. spoke ship Chitina New Bedford, 21 men the out 200 whale 400 sperm at 9 A. M. he on board and got 2 boxes of paper so ends latitude 44.53

Sunday 16th

L. B.

Commenced with fresh breezes from the North, steering by the wind to the Westward, middle and latter part moderate at 4 P. M. saw three large sperm whales going to the S. by E. at 4.30 P. M. struck one to the starboard boat got the whale spouting thin blood of the boat above and cut from the whale at dark, at 8 A. M. saw more whales struck a large one to the starboard boat and got him, got the boat slightly stove, at 10 A. M. got the whale alongside of the ship, and commenced cutting, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs 44.40 longitude 54.41

Monday 17th

Commenced with light breezes from the North, at 7 P. M. finished the body and lay by the head during the night, at 6.40 A. M. commenced on the head, at noon fresh & windy N. by E. with rain, so ends these 24 hours. No Observation

Tuesday 18th

Commenced with fresh breezes from the N. by E. at 3 P. M. wind hauled round to the N. by E. and moderate middle part the same latter part wind N. by E. at 9 A. M. saw a brig bound to the South West, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs 45.20 longitude 55.15
