

Wednesday 19th

Commenced with fresh breezes from the South, heading to the Eastward, middle part strong breezes from the Westward with some rain, latter part strong breezes from the Southward, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs. 45° 08

Thursday 20th

Commenced with strong breezes from the South, heading to the N.W. boiling, middle part light breezes latter part light air from N.W. finished boiling out the whale, 112 bbls of oil, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs. 44° 35 long 54° 31

Friday 21th

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. at 4 P.M. wore ship to the Westward, middle and latter part strong breezes with some rain and fog, so ends these 24 hours Observation

Saturday 22th

Commenced with strong gales from N.W. at 8 P.M. wind moderated and hauld, wore ship to the Northward, middle part strong gales from the Eastward, latter part moderated some, wind S.E. at 11 A.M. saw a schooner steering N.W. so ends these 24 hours, latitude by Obs. 44° 15 longitude 56° 16

Sunday 23th

Commenced with strong winds from S.E. steering S.W. at 7 P.M. luff to the Westward, middle part the same latter part strong gales from S.W. broke out the main hatchway and stowed down the oil, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Observation 43° 37

Monday 24th

Commenced with strong gales from S.W. playing too under double reef, main topsail, middle part the same latter part wind best steel S.W. so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs. 43° 37 long 55° 03

Tuesday 25th

Commenced with strong gales from the N.W. at 4 P.M. luff to the Westward, middle part the same latter part more moderate so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs. 42° 47 long 55° 34

Wednesday 26th

Commenced with fresh breezes from the South and a bad swell on, at 4 P.M. wore ship to the S.E. middle part light air from the Westward latter part moderate breezes from N.W. steering S.W. saw nothing, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Observation 43° 55 long 56° 24
