

Saturday 7th June, Commenced with light
air from the South
at 5 P.M. a boat came
too us from ship Triton
of New Bedford, reported
the loss of ship Averick of
Little, at Otaheite with 300
bbls of oil on board,
Middle and latter part light
airs, so ends these 24 hours
No observation

Sunday 8th
Commenced with light airs
from the South, steering
N.W. by N, at 10 P.M. Steered
W. by N, at daylight N.E.,
so ends these 24 hours
latitude by Obs, 13.26

Monday 9th
Commenced with light airs
from the S.E., middle and
latter part the same, so
ends these 24 hours latitude
by Observation 17.29

Tuesday 10th
Commenced with light airs
from the S.E. steering N.W.
middle and latter part light
breezes, saw black fish, so
ends these 24 hours latitude
by Observation 14.23
Land 8 miles distant

Wednesday 11th
Commenced with light trades and
pleasant weather, middle part
the same latter part fresh
breezes, Steered N.W., saw black fish
so ends these 24 hours, latitude
by Observation 16.27

Thursday 12th
Commenced with fresh breezes,
and fine weather, middle
and latter part strong gales
from the S.E., at 4 P.M. Steered
N.W. so ends these 24 hours
latitude by Obs, 14.24

Friday 13th
Commenced with strong trades
steering N.W. with the and latter
part the same, so ends these
24 hours, latitude by Observation
12.48 longitude 79.36

Saturday 14th
Commenced with strong trades
steering N.W. at 8 P.M. Steered
N.W. by N, latter part moderate
trades, so ends these 24 hours latitude
by Observation 14.43

Sunday 15th
Commenced with moderate trades
steering N.W. by N, at 7 A.M.
Steered North, saw plenty of
blackfish board 2 boats and
got one fish, so ends these 24
hours latitude by Obs, 7.42
longitude 80.42
