

Friday August 1st Commencis with moderate breezes and fine weather middle part the same latter part strong trades, at 2 P.M. wore ship to the south, so ends these 24 hours, latitude by Obs 5° 38'

Saturday 2nd Commencis with strong trades at 6 P.M. wore ship and steered North, middle part the same latter part more moderate, at Noon wore ship and steered N.W., so ends these 24 hours, latitude by Observation, 4° 13'

Sunday 3rd Commencis with fresh trades, at 6 P.M. spoke ship by sight of Fair Haven 24 months out, 1500 lbs, steered by the wind in company with her, so ends these 24 hours, latitude by Observation, 5° 40' south long 110° 38'

Monday 4th Commencis with fresh trades and clear weather, middle and latter part the same, at 6 P.M. wore ship to the eastward, at 7 P.M. wore to the south at noon back again to the North, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs 6° 17'

Tuesday 5th Commencis with fresh trades and clear weather, middle and latter part the same, so ends these 24 hours, latitude by Observation, 4° 40' south

Wednesday August 6th Commencis with moderate trades and fine weather, steering N by N middle and latter part the same, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs 2° 54' longitude 111° 25'

Thursday 7th Commencis with moderate trades and fine weather, saw blackfish, middle and latter part the same, saw blackfish, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Observation 24 miles North

Friday 8th Commencis with moderate trades and clear weather, steering N by N at 9 A.M. saw a breach which proved to be a bone shark, so ends these 24 hours, latitude by Obs 2° 35' longitude 111° 49'

Saturday 9th Commencis with moderate trades and pleasant weather, at 4 P.M. saw breaches which proved to be a shoal of sperm whales, at 5.40 P.M. heard two boats after them but too late to do any thing, looked about in hopes of seeing them again but saw nothing, so ends these 24 hours latitude by Obs 4° 17' long 112° 19'

Sunday 10th Commencis with moderate trades and pleasant weather, steering by the wind to the South, at daylight backed to the Eastward, at 4.30 A.M. saw a large sperm whale off the weather just going quick to the S.W. backed and saw him break off the weather beam, so ends latitude 4° 40' long 112° 19'
