

Saturday Oct 18th

Commenced with strong breezes, working to the middle and Lattar part the same at 8 AM sent on shore at South Head one boat with nine men and got off 17 fathoms so ends these 24 hours, Lat 54

Sunday 19th

Commenced with strong trades at 5 PM boat returned and steered off N by E until 6 PM and then steered off after a sail in sight, at 9 PM saw nothing of the sail and layed with mainyard a back during the night, at 8 AM spoke ships Alfred Doyle and Mobila, steered off for North Head, so ends these 24 hours

Monday 20th

Commenced with strong trades, middle and Lattar part moderate lay a back during the night heaved in and off shore, at daylight steered off N by E, so ends these 24 hours off the N E point

Tuesday 21st

Commenced with light airs and variable middle and Lattar part fresh breeze steered by the wind to the Eastward bound in with the Coast, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs. 36 miles

Wednesday 22nd

Commenced with moderate trades and fine weather, repaired the mizen top and bent it again, middle and Lattar part fresh breezes, so ends these 24 hours Latitude by Observation 58 miles

Thursday Oct 23rd

Commenced with moderate breezes and fine weather, steering by the wind to the Eastward, middle and Lattar part the same, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Observation 27 miles North Longitude 84.48

Friday 24th

Commenced with fresh trades and fine weather middle and Lattar part the same, so ends these 24 hours, Lat 17 miles South Longitude 82.49

Saturday 25th

Commenced with fresh trades and fine weather, steering by the wind to the Eastward, at noon saw the Land, so ends these 24 hours Latitude by Obs. 1.48 South

Sunday 26th

Commenced with fresh trades and fine weather, steering N by E, for Solange, at 4 PM spoke Bark Equator of New Bedford 24 months out 800 lbs at 8 AM spoke a schooner bound to Tacamus, at 10 AM went on shore with one boat for Plantains, so ends these 24 hours

Monday 27th

Commenced with fresh breezes and fine weather middle and Lattar part moderate breezes, tacked about to the best advantage working to Windward, saw several small vessels, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs. 41
