

Wednesday Feb 10 commences with fresh breezes from the southward, middle part the same latter part calm, so ends these 24 hours.

Thursday 11 commences with light breezes from the southward, middle part calm latter part light airs from the westward, so ends these 24 hours off Nabourough.

Friday 12 commences with light airs from the westward, middle part calm, latter part light airs from the westward, so ends these 24 hours.

Saturday 13 commences with light airs from the westward, middle part calm latter part light breezes from the southward; at 9 A.M. saw a large shoat of sperm whales going about as fast for North Head as they could go, board after them and chased but of no use, while chasing them they board from the ship the spar boat for some near they ship but could not get up with them, so ends these 24 hours off Nabourough and north head.

Sunday 14 commences with light breezes from the south, middle and latter part the same, at 7 A.M. signalled a ship called the John Adams of St. Bedford, so ends these 24 hours off N. Head.

Monday Feb 15 commences with fresh breezes from the southward, at 6 P.M. steered S by N, the rock one mile distant bearing W, middle part light trades latter part calm, so ends these 24 hours.

Tuesday 16 commences with a calm, middle part light breezes from the westward, latter part calm, so ends these 24 hours off Abington.

Wednesday 17 commences with a calm, at 4 P.M. took a light breeze from the eastward, steered N by E, at daylight steered N by E, latter part fresh trades, so ends these 24 hours, Abington bearing south 28 miles.

Thursday 18 commences with fine trades and pleasant weather, Heed up S by E middle and latter part the same, at 8 A.M. sent down the main top sail to repair it, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs. 2.05 North.

Friday 19 commences with fresh trades with some light showers of rain, middle and latter part light airs, finished the main top sail and bent it, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs. 2.32 N.
