

Friday March 12th Commencis with light breezes from the Eastward, middle and latter part light airs, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs, 50 miles South Long 84. 11

Saturday 13 Commencis with light airs, at 6 P.M. backed to the Eastward, At 9 A.M. saw a barque steering South, At 11 A.M. backed to the Southward, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs, 50 miles South

Sunday 14 Commencis with light airs, At 8 P.M. wore ship to the Eastward, middle and latter part the same, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs, 50 miles South Long 84. 8 W

Monday 15 Commencis with light trades and pleasant weather, middle and latter part the same, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs, 48 miles S Longitude 83. 10

Tuesday 16 Commencis with light trades, and fine weather, middle part the same, latter part wind North with some rain, so ends these 24 hours At Reservation

Wednesday 17 Commencis with light breezes from the Northward, Steered N.E. middle part the same latter part calm, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs, 1. 30 S Long 82. 48

Thursday 18 Commencis with light trades, Steered by the wind to the Eastward, middle and latter part the same, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs, 1. 47 Long 81. 38

Friday 19 Commencis with light airs and fine weather, Steered up S.E. & E, At 1 A.M. wore ship to the Northward, At 4 A.M. wore ship to the Eastward, so ends these 24 hours, Latitude by Obs, 1. 54 Long 81. 15

Saturday 20 Commencis with light airs, At 1 P.M. board after blackfish struck one, and drew the irish, At 5 P.M. saw Point St. Helen bearing S.E. & E distant about 28 miles, At daylight saw two ships, so ends these 24 hours, board after blackfish struck one and drew the iron, Lat 1. 56

Sunday 21 All these 24 hours light airs and calms, At 6 P.M. spoke ship Swift of New Bedford, Had taken no oil since we last saw her so ends beating up the coast
