

Tuesday November the 7th

all this Twenty four hours strong gales
from the E S E and squally, the Ship standing
by the wind to the N E, under whole top sails
jib and courses, Lat By Obs 35.26

Wednesday November the 8th

continues to blow fresh from the S S E attended
with squalls, Ship standing by the wind
to the Eastward, Lat 34.32, Long 150.27

Thursday November the 9th

all of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the Southward
and cold rugged weather, South Lat 34.12

Friday November the 10th

the first and middle part of this 24 hours strong
breezes from the S S E, the latter part more
moderate and set the top gallant sails
Lat By Obs 34.03 Long By Chron 147.11

Saturday November the 11th 1848

commences with A moderate breeze from the S S E
and the Weather cloudy, the Ship with all sail set
standing to the Eastward, Nothing of the Whale kind
Lat By Obs 33.56, the Middle part
calm and pleasant, and the latter part A light breeze
from the S E, the Watch Employed breaking out for Water

Sunday November the 12th

these four twenty hours commence with light airs
from the S E and moderate cloudy weather, from 6 to 12 P.M.
calm and fine weather, when A breeze springing up from
the Eastward, veered Ship to the South, the latter part
light airs from the S E, the Ship with all sail
set steering per Compass S E, Lat 33.58 Long 145.45
