Tuesday December the 5th

commences with a fresh gale from the N.W.
attended with rain. Ship with whole top sails and
main top gallant sail set. Steering E by N at 4 P.M.
the wind shifted to the South, and set the gill
and main sail, the latter part a moderate breeze
and fair weather, set all sail steering E.S.E.
Nothing of the Whale kind Lat 44.40 Long 91.04 30

Wednesday Dec^r the 6th

these 24 hours commences with light breezes from
the S.W. and fair weather, all sail set steering E.S.E.
the middle and latter part light breezes from the
W.S.W. and fine pleasant weather, bound to
the Longitude of 84 with the expectation of seeing
whales.

Thursday December the 7th

the first part of this 24 hours light breezes from the
West and fair weather. Ship with all drawing sail
set steering E.S.E. from 6 to 10 P.M. took in all
sail but the Double reefed main top sail & foresail
the middle and latter part strong gales from the W.S.W.
attended with rain, at 6 A.M. set the fore top sail
Double reefed, Lat by Act 44.35 Long 85.50

Friday December the 8th

all these 24 hours strong gales from the Westward and
rugged weather, Double reefed main and fore top sails set steering E.S.E.
Lat by Obs 44.48 Long by Chron 82.36 variation of the Compass 21 E

Saturday December the 9th steering E.S.E. with
Double reefed fore and main top sails set, heavy gales from the West
at 4 P.M. took in the fore & main top sail & fore sail and luffed
to the wind heading South, the middle and latter part heavy
gales, with a bad sea and some hail enough of Chile
Lat 45.04 Long 81.48
