Saturday Dec^r the 16th 1848

these 24 hours commences with fresh gales from the S.W. and fair weather, Ship under double reef^d top sails standing to the S.E. at 9 P.M. the wind from the S.W. Let the reef^d out of the top sails and kept S.E. the middle and latter part occasional squalls attended with hail and snow, at 12 M kept off E by S

Sunday Dec^r the 17th

the first and middle part of this 24 hours fresh breezes from the N.W. attended with squalls of hail and snow, the latter part light breezes from the West with some snow
