

Friday the 23rd of March

Commences with A light air from the Westward and fair weather, Ship standing to the Northward the Middle part equally appearances furled the top gallant sails & flying jib, and at 8 AM the wind shifted to the NNE from 7 to 9 AM Double reefed the top sails, and furled the jib and main course at 11 set the main sail reefed and set the jib, Ends with fresh gales Lat By Obs 29.12 Long By Chron 66.12 Sen Bedford N 17° W 780 miles Distat

Saturday the 24th of March

all these four and twenty hours strong gales from the NNE, and rugged weather the Ship with all prudent sail set, standing to the NW North Lat By Obs 30.00 west Long By Chron 66.45

Returning ^{home} after a long absence, from all our holds Dear what pleasing anticipations fill the heart. But we know not how soon our cherished hopes will be blighted and we left to return to our wanderings

Sunday the 25th of March 1849

these 24 hours make their appearance with strong gales from the NNE attended with rugged hazy weather the Ship with with Double reefed top sails set standing to the NW, the Middle part the wind from the NNE Let one reef out of the top sails, and hauld up N by N. the Lat part equally from the East Ship steering NNE Lat By Obs 30.58 Long 68.01 Sen Bedford N 12° W Dist 650 miles

Monday the 26th of March

all this 24 hours light breeze from the East & SE, Ship with all sail set steering NNE, at 10 AM the Capt went on board of the Brig Tremont of Frankfort, 8 days from Bath Lat By Obs 32.07 Long by Chron 68.55
