Heading S. E. under Short Sail Middle
Part stood various tack with Part of all Sail
Cut Latter Part rain and fog one Whalman
in Sight several Steamers in Sight
So end of this day

Friday May 3rd 1907
This day began with Light N. E. Wind
with rain and fog Middle and Latter Part
stood various tack with Part of all Sail
Cut at Sun late took in Sail one Whalman
in Sight So end of this day
Lat 37. 11. N. Long 73. 46. W.

Friday May 4th 1907

This day began with Strong E. N. E. Wind
with rain Squall Middle Part Blown heavy Gale
from S. W. Latter Part Moderat Saw one Steamer
and Whalman So end of this day
No. 66

Sunday May 5th 1907
This day began with Strong Westerly Wind
with heavy Sea running from S. W. heading
N. under reef Drierail Middle and Latter Part
Light Easterly Wind stood various tack with
Part of all Sail Cut Saw several merchant ships
So end of this day
Lat 37. 33. N. Long 73. 38. W.

Monday May 6th 1907
This day began with Light Easterly Wind
Middle and Latter Part Blown Strong from South
with heavy rain Squall Laying to under reef
Drierail Saw one Steamer Bound North
So end of this day
No. 66

Tuesday May 7th 1907
This day began with Strong S. W. Wind heading
S. E. under reef Drierail Middle and Latter Part
Moderat with thick fog So end of this day
No. 66

Wednesday May 8th 1907
This day began with calm and fog Laying under
Short Sail Middle and Latter Part Light N. E.
Wind stood various tack with Part of all Sail Cut
Mr Loper raised Sperm Whale Lowered Boat Whale
Went out sight come on Board with out Success Spoke
to W. W. A. Crozier So end of this day
No. 66
