

Remarks on board Ship Eliza Adams

160 Tuesday February 24th Lat Long S R
 This day had the trade light under, all sail on opposite tacks latter part under short sail and one sail

161 Wednesday Feb 25th
 This day had the trade strong steering off N.W. shot at 10 a.m. Schooner Carrie W. Clark of Provincetown got out water and employed at other ships duties so ends the day under short sail

162 Thursday Feb 26th
 Short part of this day fresh breeze from S. S.W. Employed at ships duties at 7 P.M. Landed with ship fish Perry 6 months out 340 lbs so ends the day under short sail

163 Friday Feb 27th
 Fresh breeze from the Southward Employed at ship duties at 4 P.M. Landed with the fish Perry latter part under top sails heading to the westward

164 Saturday Feb 28th
 This day commenced with fresh breeze steering off N.W. weather some cloudy latter part by the wind under short sail

165 Sunday February 29th Lat Long S R
 This day weather light but hazy from the S.E. so ends the day under short sail

166 Monday March 1st
 Short part of this day fresh breeze from the Southward Employed at other ship duties and the ship fish Perry steering off to the N.W. latter part under short sail with thick foggy weather so ends the day heading to the Eastward

167 Tuesday March 2nd
 Light winds with thick fog by speeds saw the ship fish Perry off and at 6 P.M. Landed with the Blk. Littleboro latter part steering N.W. under top sails main & thick

Wednesday March 3rd
 168 This day commenced as above steering to the N.W. got out water saw Black Fish and at 2 P.M. Landed with the ship fish Perry latter part moderate Lying aback

169 Thursday March 4th
 Light S.E. winds with quite pleasant weather steering N.W. under all sail also the fish Perry employed at various jobs making 4000 yams etc latter part steering N.W. by N.
