

Remarks on board Ship Eliza Adams

Lat 14-37 S

Sunday March 14th

179 This day fresh breezes at day bright commenced to beat and finished at 7 A.M. saw the Br. Grapeland and one other sail at 9 P.M. started the works so ends the day lying aback heading to the Eastward

Monday March 15th

180 Light pleasant weather all hands employed cutting up the W. hall and opening the case so ends the day Bailing

Tuesday March 16th

181 This day commenced with strong breezes under lower topsail Bailing so ends the day

Wednesday March 17th

182 This day had the trades quite fresh saw the Ship Sir John Plover and sailed with the Br. Stafford 6 months out 270 at 3 P.M. finished Bailing reeling from the color 130 lbs so ends the day with moderate weather

Thursday March 18th

183 This day strong S.E. trades with some light squalls under lower topsails & the sail employed various jobs at ship on opposite tacks so ends the day

Friday March 19th

184 Strong breeze with cloudy weather all hands employed coopers, and standing the oil between decks finished at 4 P.M. standing 122 lbs so ends the day under lower top sails

Lat 14-40 S

Long 48-08 W.

185 Saturday March 20th This 24 hours strong breeze with some squalls on opposite tacks employed at various jobs got out water sun down took in upper topsails so ends the day

Sunday March 21st

186 This day strong breeze from S.E. under lower topsails & coopers weather some squally ship heading to the S.W. also saw 2 sails so ends the day

Monday March 22nd

186 This 24 hours fresh breeze from S.E. on opposite tacks under top sails saw one sail sun down took in upper topsails so ends the day heading to the Eastward

Tuesday March 23rd

187 This day had the trades quite fresh under topsails on opposite tacks saw 2 sails employed making a star for a top Gallant yard and sent it up in the place of the one that was carried away on 13 of March weather some cloudy
