

Remarks on board Ship Eliza Adams
Sailed from St. Helena

211 Friday April 16th
Strong breeze with pleasant weather
desert from the ship one Boatster and
4 men from forward 9. ends the day

212 Saturday April 17th
Strong breeze at 7 A.M. got under
way leaving the Capt on shore Boat
went on shore at 10 A.M. and return
at 8 P.M. latter part standing
off shore under lower top sails and
courses hailing with the Morgan &
Laurica so ends the day stand the cable
and anchor

213 Sunday April 18th
Light pleasant weather standing
in shore an company with the
Morgan & Laurica land in sight
latter part off St. Helena

214 Monday April 19th
Strong breeze at 8 A.M. Boat went on
shore came off at 11 A.M. latter part off on
the Mate & Capt on shore also the Morgan
also the Blk President off shore and Laurica
so ends the day

215 Tuesday April 20th
Strong breeze at 9 A.M. the Boat went
off shore came off at 12.30 at 2 P.M.
went on shore and came off at 6 P.M.
Shiped 5 men the Capt. W. Capre off at 5.30
in company with the Capt. of the Morgan
also some shipping, passing the Island
the Blk. Sisco sailed at 8 P.M. latter
part heading off shore under top sails
weather pleasant

216 Wednesday April 21st Left Long S
TW
This day had the trader Strong said the
Blk Sisco and at 4 P.M. sailed with the
Blk Morgan St. Helena at sun down
having S.W. Dist. 40 miles latter part
standing off shore

217 Thursday April 22nd
Fore part of this 24 hours Strong breeze
under lower top sail heading by the wind. &
some squally sun down Chopped Boats crew
so ends the day

218 Friday April 23rd
This 24 hours light pleasant weather under
all sail pointed the S. B. so end the day
heading by compass E.

219 Saturday April 24th
Fresh breeze under all sail by the wind heading
E at 8 A.M. sail a sail off the lee beam
at 2.30 made her out to be a Whaling
kept off and at 4.30 saw her Boat that she
was striking whales along side at 5 P.M. rose
the whales going off to the leeward quick
at sun down took in the light sails
& courses and put to the wind heading E
the Blk. Stafford the off our lee about 2 miles
so ends the day
