

Remarks on board Bk. of Allen

- 170 Friday February 24th Lat Long 41:48 111
This 24 hours strong westerly winds on
opposite tacks came with the Horatio so
ends the day under short sail
- 171 Saturday Feb 25th
This day fresh breeze from the Westward
under full sail heading to the Northward
saw the Horatio this morning
- 172 Sunday Feb 26th Lat 41:48 Long 75:58
This 24 hours blowing a moderate sail
from S.W. with heavy squalls ship heading
to the N.W. to ends the day
- 173 Monday Feb 27th Lat 40:44
This 24 hours more moderate wind the
same as above steering N.W. by N. came
with the J. A. Winthrop got out meat
- 174 Tuesday Feb 28th
This 24 hours fresh breeze from S.W.
steering N.W. by N. the J. A. Winthrop in
sight so ends the day under short sail
- 175 Wednesday March 1st Lat 38:03
This 24 hours fresh breeze from S.W.
steering N.W. by N. under all sail the
J. A. Winthrop in sight
- 176 Thursday March 2nd
This 24 hours fresh breeze from S.W.
heading to the N.W. and 2 sails all
hands employed washing board so ends
the day heading to the Westward

- 177 Friday March 3rd Lat Long 41:48 111
Fore part of this day blowing a moderate
sail S.W. steering N.W. by N. under top sails
at 3 P.M. sighted the Phoebe
- 178 Saturday March 4th
Fore part of this day blowing a fresh
sail day light kept off steering N.W. by N.
for P.M. day got up the cables
and dropped the Starboard anchor at
3.30 P.M. 8 miles N.W. of the town saw 2 sails
so ends the day
- 179 Sunday March 5th
This day more moderate from South
the Capt went on shore after the Mate
so ends the day
- 180 Monday March 6th
Employed at ship duties got 10 sacks of
potatoes Discharged one man sick left the
Mate on shore in case of medical treatment
Capt came on board at 12 P.M. got under
way and anchored again 4 miles further
down the Bay on account of light air
and calm
- 181 Tuesday March 7th
Light air from the North took anchor
and went in more under quinquino
and anchored again Employed at various
jobs so ends the day also thick foggy
weather
- 182 Wednesday March 8th
This 24 hours strong breeze from South
took the anchor at 6 P.M. and sailed
steering N.W. by N. so ends the day heading
S.W. under double reef top sails
