

Remarks on board Bk. J. Allen

- 183 Thursday March 9th Lat Long 111
 Fore part of this day blowing fresh from South heading S.W. latter part more moderate heading N.E. & under double reef top sails.
- 184 Friday March 10th
 Blowing a fresh gale from South under lower top sails spoke the Horatio and saw the John A. Winthrop ship on opposite tack.
- 185 Saturday March 11th
 Still continued to blow from the same as above on opposite tack saw the Horatio washed ship in side.
- 186 Sunday March 12th
 Strong South winds etc. Horatio in sight ship heading N.E. so ends its day.
- 187 Monday March 13th
 Strong breeze from South heading N.E. & gaining with the Horatio also at 8 P.M. rose Spinnaker Whales going quick lured the Boats in chase B.B. of the James Allen got one hook thin. along side at 6 P.M. so ends the day.
- 188 Tuesday March 14th
 Strong southerly winds employed diluting tank the food on board the Horatio started the works at 4 P.M. so ends the day on opposite tack.
- 189 Wednesday March 15th
 Boreally fresh from South by the mid heading N.E. & boiling.

Anchored at Talcahuano Harbor at 10 P.M. viz 4 fathoms of water so ends the day boiling.

190 Thursday March 16th
 Weather pleasant from North the Capt & his wife also Capt Purser wife went on shore finished boiling at 10 P.M. making 83 lbs 40 went to the ship Horatio which was mated at the time the whale was taken.

Friday March 17th
 Employed getting out oil and setting up shaker sold at Talcahuano 2.75 lbs of Whight Whale oil at 50 cents per Gallon in a Mexican gold also shipped home by the Bk. Napodon 121 lbs of Spinnaker oil and 2.450 Pounds of Whale. bone.

April 10th 1882

Discharged from Bk. James Allen at Talcahuano first Officer Obed Coppins on account of sickness.

Re-shipped April 15th late 2nd Officer J. Lory as first mate of Bk. J. Allen J. A. West 2nd mate of " " " "

Also sold at Talcahuano March 1882 112 Gallons of Spinnaker oil.
