

Remarks on board

Sunday Nov 21st 1841

This day commences with strong breezes from N.W. and fair weather shook reefs out topsails and set top gallant sails and fly-gill set up the standing rigging in the first part of the day latter part strong breeze at 1/2 past three A.M. took in fly-gill and fore top gallant sail wind S.E. and clear weather
 Lat 48° 42' N. Lat. 39° 24' N.

Monday Nov 22nd 1841

This day commences with strong winds and clear weather with the wind from the S.E. at five P.M. took in main top gallant sail reefed the top-sails furled the gill and spunkier at nine o'clock P.M. took in the main-sail at ten P.M. furled fore-top-sail at eleven furled fore sail and close reefed main top-sail

Tuesday Nov 23rd 1841

This day commences with light winds and squalls of rain at 1/2 past one P.M. shook two reefs out the top-sails and set the main-sail with the wind S.W. steering E.S.E. at two o'clock P.M. the wind hauled to the northward and we put her upon the other tack steering S.E. by E. at six P.M. shook one reef out of each top sail and set the main top gallant sail and at seven took it in again the latter part strong breezes and squally weather steering E.S.E.
 Lat 40° 22' N.

Wednesday Nov 24th 1841

This day commences with strong winds and clear weather at two P.M. saw a ship ahead steering to the Eastward - winds from N.W. at 1/2 past one P.M. set main top gallant sail and at two took it in again at three doubled

reefed the top-sails with strong winds from N.W. steering S.E. by E. latter part much the same as the first all hands employed in ordinary ships duty Lat. 40° 11' N. Lon 41. 00 W.

Thursday Nov 25th 1841

This day commences with strong winds and squally weather with the wind from N.W. ship under double reefed top-sails steering S.E. by E. latter part winds from the W.S.W. at one o'clock P.M. altered our course to S.E. shook reefs out of the top-sails and set the topgallant-sails at ten P.M. took them in again all hands employed in ships duty Lat 38° 42' N.

Friday Nov 26th 1841

This day commences with strong winds from W.S.W. and squally weather at four we single reefed the top sail at seven P.M. we doubled-reefed them at ten P.M. took in the fore top-sail and fore-sail and close reefed the main top-sail and hove the ship too at 1/2 past eleven A.M. the wind being W.S.W. we squared in the yard and steared her S.E. and set the fore-sail the weather more moderate Lat 38° 56' N.

Saturday Nov 27th 1841

This day commences with strong winds from N.W. at one P.M. we altered our course to E.S.E. and set double-reefed top-sails at 1/2 past ten shook one reef out the top-sails and at six A.M. set main topgallant sail at seven saw a whale spout and took in main topgallant-sail and double reefed the top sails at eight shook them out again for we could not see that whale latter part strong breezes from W. by N. and steering E.S.E. So ends these seventy-four hours Lat 39° 14' N.
