

Remarks on board

Sunday Nov 28th 1841

This day commences with strong winds W. and some squalls at two P.M. we made the Island of Flores and then shaped our course for Fayall at four P.M. took in topgallant sail - at five P.M. doubled-reefed the top-sails middle part strong breezes from the west with some rain at eight A.M. made Fayall and steered for the harbor at 1/2 past eleven A.M. we were off the harbor but it was so squally that we was obliged to pass by leaving four vessels at anchor there

Monday Nov 29th 1841

This day commences with strong winds from W. by S. we lost upon the wind heading N. by W. at 1/2 past one P.M. we double reefed fore and main top-sails and furled the gib and at 1/2 past four lost sight of the light middle and latter part strong winds from the W. S. W. heading N. W.

Tuesday Nov 30th

This day commences with strong winds from the W. at 1/2 past one A.M. we squared the yards and kept her E. N. E. at 1/4 to four we had a severe squall which carried away our main and main top sail yards all hands were called to clear the wreck we luffed the ship to and furled the fore and fore top sails and hauled out main spencer ship heading N. W. W. at six A.M. set the fore sail and kept her E. by S. at seven A.M. set close reefed fore top sail and kept her E. S. E. at nine A.M. steered S. with the wind from the N. W. all hands employed in ship's duty

Wednesday Decem 1st 1841

This day commences with strong winds from N. W. and squally weather steering S. at two P.M. shook reefs out of fore topsail all hands cleared away to send down the main top sail out of the main top at six P.M. altered our course to S. E. by S. middle and latter parts light winds and heavy rain at five A.M. set fore topgallant sail and gib winds from the S. ship steering S. E. by E. all hands employed in fitting shant

Thursday Decem 2nd 1841

This day commences with strong winds from the S. W. and heavy rains at one P.M. took in fore top gallant sail at four P.M. doubled reefed fore topsail and furled the gib ship steering S. E. middle and latter parts strong winds from the W. and clear weather at eleven A.M. shook reefs out fore topsail and set gib Lat 37° 31' N. Lon 22° 36' W by Chis

Friday Decem 3rd 1841

This day commences with more moderate and pleasant weather winds from the W. at two P.M. set fore top gallant sail ship steering S. W. middle part light winds and clear weather at six A.M. took in fore topgallant sail and at seven furled the gib and double reefed the fore topsail at eight set the gib and at nine shook the reefs out the fore topsail at ten set the fore topgallant sail and fly gib at eleven took the fly gib in again ship steering S. W. all hands employed in ship's duty and the carpenter making a main yard

Lat 34° 28' N. Lon. 22° W
