

Remarks on board
Saturday Decem 4th 1841

This day commences with light winds from the S.W. and pleasant weather middle part no wind latter part light winds from S.W. at seven P.M. hauled up the fore-sail and spanker at eight P.M. clewed up the fore top gallant-sail and clewed down the fore topsail at eleven P.M. hoisted the fore top sail and set the fore top gallant-sail at nine A.M. clewed up the fore top gallant-sail and hauled down the gill and so ends these twentyfour hours

Sunday Decem 5th 1841

This day commences with steady winds from S.W. but soon became squally at one P.M. hoisted the gill and set the fore top gallant-sail at four P.M. clewed up the fore top gallant-sail hauled down the gill and furlled them at five double fresh fore top-sail ship heading W. by S. middle part light winds from W. by S. and pleasant weather at nine P.M. set the jib and shook one reef out of the fore top-sail at four A.M. shook one reef out of the fore top-sail at six set the fore top gallant-sail latter part much the same as the middle all hands employed in ships duty

Monday Decem 6th 1841

This day commences with moderate winds from S.W. and pleasant weather at five P.M. tuck ship and stood to the westward middle part light winds from the S. and pleasant weather latter part strong breezes from S.E. ship steering S.W. by S. all hands employed in ships duty
Lat 33° 33' N.

Barge Elizabeth

Tuesday Decem 7th 1841

The first part of this day strong breezes from S.E. and pleasant weather at five P.M. sent our main yard aloft and bent the main-sail ship steering S.W. by S. middle and latter strong winds from E.S.E. and pleasant weather all hands employed in ships duty Lat 32° 25' N.

Wednesday Decem 8th 1841

This day commences with strong winds from E.S.E. and pleasant weather ship steering S.W. middle and latter parts strong winds from E.S.E. and pleasant weather all hands employed in fitting rigging and main top-sail yard ship steering S.W.
Lat 30° 05' N.

Thursday Decem 9th 1841

This day commences with strong winds from S.E. by E. and pleasant weather ship steering S.W. middle and latter parts strong winds from East and pleasant weather all hands employed in fitting rigging and main top-sail yard Lat 27° 35' N.

Friday Decem 10th 1841

This day commences with light winds from the E. and pleasant weather at four P.M. unbent our fore top gallant-sail to repair and sent up another middle and latter parts light winds from and pleasant weather all hands employed fitting rigging and main top-sail yard ship steered S.W.
Lat 26° 05' N.

Saturday Decem 11th 1841

This day commences with light winds from E.S.E. and pleasant weather at two P.M. altered our course S. by W. and at four P.M. lowered the boats and pulled to exercise the crews at five P.M. came along side and hoisted up again; middle part calm at eleven
