

Remarks on board

Monday Jan 17th

This day commences with fine breezes and pleasant the tracts verging about two points each way middle and latter parts strong winds and pleasant weather ship on the wind with her larboard tacks aboard all hands employed in ships duty Lat 12° 52' S.

Tuesday Jan 18th

This day commences with strong winds and pleasant weather at one P.M. saw a sail standing the same way that we were ship heading E. by N. middle part moderate breezes from E. S. E. and pleasant weather at ten P.M. hauled down the fly jib latter part strong breezes and squally weather at four clewed down the fore top gallant sail and down the main hauled down the jib and hauled up the gaff top sail and spanker at five A.M. set them again at six saw a sail ahead at nine A.M. got a breast back stay on the main top gallant mast ship on the wind larboard tacks aboard all hands employed in ships duty Lat

Wednesday Jan 19th

This day commences with strong winds from E. and clear weather at five P.M. set up the main top mast back stays middle part strong winds from the eastward and squally weather at ten hauled down the fly jib at one A.M. clewed up the fore top gallant sail and hauled up the gaff top sail at 1/2 past three set them again ship heading S. all hands employed in turning in the larboard fore rigging

Thursday Jan 20th

This day commences with fine winds from E. and pleasant weather at three had a squall took in the fly jib and fore top gallant sail at four set them again all hands employed in setting up starboard fore rigging middle and latter parts strong winds from E. and pleasant weather all hands employed in ships duty Lat 19° 53' S.

Barge Elizabeth

Friday Jan 21st

This day commences with strong winds and squally weather ship heading E. S. E. middle part squally at ten took in the fly jib fore top gallant sail gaff top sail spanker and clewed up the main top gallant sail and hauled down the jib clewed up the main sail and down the fore top sail latter part squally and heavy rain at eleven A.M. made sail again all hands employed in ships duty Lat 21° 13' S.

Saturday Jan 22nd

This day commences with squally weather and moderate winds from E. by N. at six P.M. wind hauled E. S. E. ship heading S. by E. middle and latter parts light winds and pleasant weather at eight A.M. saw a school of sperm whales lowered our boats and chased them but got none they were going quick to the westward came aboard and stood on our way ship heading E. by S. on the wind all hands employed in ships duty Lat 23° 12' S.

Sunday Jan 23rd

This day commences with light winds from E. S. E. ship on the wind with her larboard tacks aboard middle and latter parts much like the first no work going on these twenty-four hours ship heading E. by S. Lat 24° 55' S.

Monday Jan 24th

This day commences with light winds from E. S. E. and pleasant weather ship by the wind heading S. by E. middle and latter parts light winds from E. and pleasant weather ship heading E. S. E. all hands employed in breaking out for water Lat 25° 53' S.

Tuesday Jan 25th

This day commences with calm and pleasant weather middle and latter parts light winds from E. S. E. and pleasant weather at seven A.M. raised a school of sperm whales lowered our boats and took one whale all hands employed in whaling *
